

## A few hours of energy storage

Energy storage's ability to store electricity when demand is low and discharge stored electricity when demand is high could offer significant value to the grid, but it does add ...

This simulation used 24GW/120GWh (five hours at average demand) and achieved 98.8% renewable supply at a cost of \$95/MWh, including the cost of additional transmission, storage and curtailment.

However, the term "long-duration energy storage" is often used as shorthand for storage with sufficient duration to provide firm capacity and support grid resource adequacy. The actual duration needed for this application varies significantly from as little as a few hours to potentially multiple days. This leads to the unsatisfying conclusion ...

We estimate that by 2040, LDES deployment could result in the avoidance of 1.5 to 2.3 gigatons of CO<sub>2</sub> equivalent per year, or around 10 to 15 percent of today's power sector emissions. In the United States alone, LDES could reduce the overall cost of achieving a fully decarbonized power system by around \$35 billion annually by 2040.

The ability of 4-hour storage to meet peak demand during the summer is further enhanced with greater deployments of solar energy. In 2021, the U.S. had 43 operating pumped hydro plants with a total generating capacity of about 22 gigawatts and an energy storage capacity of 553 gigawatt-hours. They make up 93% of utility ...

The NREL team, led by Dr. Chad Hunter, compared the monetary costs and revenues of fourteen different

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energy storage technologies that can operate for 12 hours or more. They published their results in the journal *Joule*.

Today, worldwide installed and operational storage power capacity is approximately 173.7 GW (ref. 2). Short-duration storage -- up to 10 hours of discharge duration at rated power before the energy capacity is depleted -- accounts for approximately 93% of that storage power capacity 2.

Of the new storage capacity, more than 90% has a duration of 4 hours or less, and in the last few years, Li-ion batteries have provided about 99% of new capacity.

A study by the Fraunhofer Institute for Solar Energy Systems from 2021 concludes that largely new flexibility options - stationary and mobile batteries, heat pumps, methanisation, power-to-liquid and hydrogen electrolysis - will have to absorb and store between 274 terawatt hours (TWh) and 413 TWh of energy per year in a fully decarbonised ...
