Additionally, power derived from solar panels and wind turbines located close to the abandoned oil and gas wells could potentially be converted into high pressure air via compressor. Once converted, that high pressure air could be guided through the pipes to the subsurface saline aquifers, 1,000 ft to 8,000 ft below surface.

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not only eliminates the need for storage vessels but also facilitates the implementation of an isothermal process for compressed air storage, resulting in improved round-trip efficiency.

Energy storage in decommissioned oil wells entails using these wells to store a variety of forms of energy, including thermal, pumped hydro, and compressed air. The idea is to utilize the wells' subsurface reservoirs to store energy during times of excess supply and release it during times of high demand (Matos et al., 2019).

Aside from geothermal energy production, abandoned oil wells have other applications. Converting them for underground natural gas, carbon dioxide, or hydrogen storage can aid in energy storage and carbon capture operations.
