Both elements can be charged (i.e., the stored energy is increased) or discharged (i.e., the stored energy is decreased). Ideal capacitors and inductors can store energy indefinitely; however, in practice, discrete capacitors and inductors exhibit "leakage," which typically results in a gradual reduction in the stored energy over time.

In switching voltage regulators and other energy storage apps, bigger Q is better. The best off-the-shelf inductors (all non-superconducting) at popular suppliers have a Q factor of 150 @ 25KHz. Most capacitors have an order of magnitude better energy storage (higher Q) than that. People can and do store some energy in inductors for use later.

A: Energy is stored in a capacitor when an electric field is created between its plates. This occurs when a voltage is applied across the capacitor, causing charges to accumulate on the plates.
