

Can water store energy

Energy is stored by pumping water from a surface pond under pressure into the pore spaces of underground rocks at depths of between 300 and 600 meters; electricity is generated by uncapping the well and letting the water gush to the surface and spin a turbine.

PSH plants store energy by pumping water from a lower reservoir to a higher reservoir using electricity generated during off-peak periods. During peak demand periods, the water flows back down to the lower reservoir, generating electricity. The Nant de Drance pumped storage hydropower plant in Switzerland can store surplus energy from wind, solar, and other clean sources by pumping water from a lower reservoir to an upper one, 425 meters higher. When electricity runs short, the water can be unleashed through turbines, generating up to 900 megawatts of electricity for 20 hours.
