

Capacitor circuit with initial energy storage

A 165 mF capacitor is used in conjunction with a motor. How much energy is stored in it when 119 V is applied? Suppose you have a 9.00 V battery, a 2.00 mF capacitor, and a 7.40 mF capacitor. (a) Find the charge and energy stored if the capacitors are connected to the battery in series. (b) Do the same for a parallel connection.

To find the current in the capacitor we have to apply KCL at the marked node: $i_1 = i + i_C$ $0A = 2A + i_C$ $i_C = -2A$ $dV/dt = i_C / C = -2A / (.25F) = -8V/s$ dV/dt is negative, therefore for $t > 0$ the capacitor is discharging. The energy stored in the capacitor is being absorbed by the resistor. Eventually all the initial energy stored in the capacitor ...

A capacitor is a device that stores electrical charge. The simplest capacitor is the parallel plates capacitor, which holds two opposite charges that create a uniform electric field between the plates. Therefore, the energy in a capacitor comes from the potential difference between the charges on its plates.

Energy Storage Equation. The energy (E) stored in a capacitor is given by the following formula: $E = \frac{1}{2} CV^2$. Where: E represents the energy stored in the capacitor, measured in joules (J). C is the capacitance of the capacitor, measured in farads (F). V denotes the voltage applied across the capacitor, measured in volts (V). Derivation of the ...

The energy stored on a capacitor can be expressed in terms of the work done by the battery. Voltage represents energy per unit charge, so the work to move a charge element dq from the negative plate to the positive plate is equal to $V dq$, where V is the voltage on the capacitor. The voltage V is proportional to the amount of charge which is already on the capacitor.

A parallel combination of three capacitors, with one plate of each capacitor connected to one side of the circuit and the other plate connected to the other side, is illustrated in Figure (PageIndex{2a}).
