Energy storage in capacitors refers to the ability of a capacitor to store electrical energy in an electric field created between its plates when a voltage is applied. The energy stored on a capacitor can be expressed in terms of the work done by the battery. Voltage represents energy per unit charge, so the work to move a charge element dq from the negative plate to the positive plate is equal to V dq, where V is the voltage on the capacitor. The voltage V is proportional to the amount of charge which is already on the capacitor.
