

The average voltage on the capacitor during the charging process is V / 2, and so the average voltage experienced by the full charge q is V / 2. These two distinct energy storage mechanisms are represented in electric circuits by two ideal circuit elements: the ideal capacitor and the ideal inductor, which approximate the behavior of actual discrete capacitors and inductors. They also approximate the bulk properties of capacitance and inductance that are present in any physical system.

What is a Capacitor? A capacitor is a two-terminal passive electrical component that can store electrical energy in an electric field. This effect of a capacitor is known as capacitance. Whilst some capacitance may exists between any two electrical conductors in a circuit, capacitors are components designed to add capacitance to a circuit.

Capacitors used for energy storage. Capacitors are devices which store electrical energy in the form of electrical charge accumulated on their plates. When a capacitor is connected to a power source, it accumulates energy which can be released when the capacitor is disconnected from the charging source, and in this respect they are similar to batteries.



The total work W needed to charge a capacitor is the electrical potential energy UC U C stored in it, or UC = W U C = W. When the charge is expressed in coulombs, potential is expressed in volts, and the capacitance is expressed in farads, this relation gives the energy in joules.

Another output of the capacitor energy calculator is the capacitor's charge Q Q. The equation for energy stored in a capacitor can be derived from the definition of capacitance and the work done to charge the capacitor. Capacitance is defined as: C = Q/V Where Q is the charge stored on the capacitor's plates and V is the voltage across the capacitor.
