

Cuba power plant energy storage

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The situation came to a head on Friday, when Cuba's largest power plant malfunctioned, joining several smaller plants already offline. Foul weather had also stalled the arrival of fuel from tanker ships offshore, starving the island's power plants. The combination prompted the entire grid to collapse.

Currently in Cuba, the application of energy storage technology is mainly concentrated in some off-grid power generation systems and renewable energy demonstration projects. The overall research and development and commercialization process are relatively slow, and a large-scale market has not yet been formed.

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In fact, seven of the eight thermoelectric plants that supply energy to Cuba are broken or under maintenance, according to a statement released this Wednesday by the Cuban Electric Union and the Ministry of Energy and Mines of the island.

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As battery prices continue to fall and the penetration of variable wind and solar generation rises, power plant developers are increasingly turning to these "hybrid" power plants. By the end of 2020, roughly 70 solar-plus-storage power plants were in operation in the United States, representing almost 1GW of solar and 250MW of battery capacity.

On Monday, Cuban authorities reported the installation of solar energy panels, which they hope will increase the energy generation capacity on the island. But the first of the announced projects - which would produce about 1,000 watts of electricity per hour - will only be ready in two years.

Cuba's largest power plant has been identified to be the cause of an energy collapse on Sunday October 20th, causing a more than 72 hour blackout in the entire nation. Authorities informed that the power plant had been deteriorating for the past few decades and it is not the only one in the country under those concerning circumstances.

By 2030, Cuba aims to have 24% of electrical generation from renewable sources. Cuba's INDC commits to 19 bioelectric power plants fueled with wood and/or sugar cane residue (755MW), 13 wind farms (633 MW), solar photovoltaics (700MW), and 74 small hydroelectric plants for a total of 2,144 MW of renewable energy by 2030.

The Cuban Electric Union has also reported that 37 power generation plants are out of service due to lack of fuel. These plants are in the areas of the Mariel, Mariel and Santiago de Cuba.

Officials said the state-owned power company UNE was using distributed generation to provide power to some areas of the island and that a gas-fired thermoelectric plant was starting operations. Cuba gets its power from huge thermoelectric plants like Antonio Guiteras and some smaller ones, which require crude oil to operate.
