Several important parameters describe the behaviors of battery energy storage systems. Capacity [Ah]: The amount of electric charge the system can deliver to the connected load while maintaining acceptable voltage.

The so-called battery "charges" when power is used to pump water from a lower reservoir to a higher reservoir. The energy storage system "discharges" power when water, pulled by gravity, is released back to the lower-elevation reservoir and passes through a turbine along the way.
