

# Distributed water tower energy storage

A water tower is an incredibly simple device. Although water towers come in all shapes and sizes, they all do the same thing: A water tower is simply a large, elevated tank of water. When you add a solar cell to the water tower / turbine / pump scheme, what you essentially have is a solar power system employing a water tower as an energy storage device. Such a system could store collected solar energy by pumping water up into the tower, and when the sun isn't shining, the system can still produce power from the turbine.

In all cases, the energy needed to pump the water up the tower is greater than or equal to the amount of energy that would be harnessed from allowing the water to flow from said water tower. Free Energy comes into play when the amount of output energy is greater than the amount of input energy.

The quick and dirty answer to your question is yes. You could create electricity using the potential energy of the water stored in the water tower of height ( $h$  meters). HOWEVER, you would also have to consider the amount of energy that would be needed to pump the same volume of water to a height of  $h$  meters.

An elevated storage tank is one component of a more extensive water distribution system. On most days, water demand will follow a predictable schedule. Higher demand happens during the day, and the water storage tower refills overnight. However, water utilities need the flexibility to respond to unexpected situations.

Water is pumped from a lower elevation reservoir to a higher one and later flows back to the lower reservoir through a turbine. For areas with naturally large elevation changes, PSH has been an ...

The relatively low energy density of pumped storage systems requires either large flows and/or large differences in height between reservoirs. The only way to store a significant amount of energy is by having a large body of water located relatively near, but as high as possible above, a second body of water.

The water tower can hold 20,000 to 30,000 gallons of water. Could this have enough pressure to send the water down a pipe and pass it through an electric generator where it will cause a turbine to rotate and produce electricity? Once the water passes through the generator it can be redirected back to the water pump.

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
