

# Do new energy sources require energy storage

The fire codes require battery energy storage systems to be certified to UL 9540, Energy Storage Systems and Equipment. Each major component - battery, power conversion system, and energy storage management system - must be certified to its own UL standard, and UL 9540 validates the proper integration of the complete system.

The biggest challenge to solar technology is that it cannot be a standalone solution; it needs complementary storage technologies like batteries to be fully accessible 24/7. Pumped storage hydropower is one common method, albeit one that requires reservoirs at different elevations and is limited by geography. Another approach relies on what is known as thermal energy storage, or TES, which uses molten salt or even superheated rocks.

As the cost of solar and wind power has in many places dropped below fossil fuels, the need for cheap and abundant energy storage has become a key challenge for building an energy system that does not emit greenhouse gases or contribute to climate change.
