

# Energy density of inertial energy storage

The amount of energy that can be stored is proportional to the object's moment of inertia times the square of its angular velocity. To optimize the energy-to-mass ratio, the flywheel must spin at the maximum possible speed. ... they have several advantages over chemical energy storage. Thanks to the unique advantages such as long life cycles, high power density and quality, and minimal environmental impact, the flywheel/kinetic energy storage system (FESS) is gaining steam recently.
