This gives you how much energy your battery bank should be able to supply without any solar charging. Since battery backup days are also called days of autonomy, I'll refer to this as your autonomous energy consumption. Autonomous energy consumption = Daily energy consumption \* Battery backup days  
Autonomous energy consumption = 2,760 Wh/day ...

For example, a battery with 1 MW of power capacity and 4 MWh of usable energy capacity will have a storage duration of four hours. Cycle life/lifetime is the amount of time or cycles a battery storage system can provide regular charging and discharging before failure or significant degradation.

1 &#0183; To calculate backup time, divide the battery's total capacity by your energy usage per hour. If your system's consumption is 2 kWh, the calculation looks like this: Backup Time = Battery Capacity (kWh) / Power Consumption (kWh) Backup Time = 10 kWh / 2 kWh = 5 hours. ...

Batteries aren't for everyone, but in some areas, a solar-plus-storage system can offer higher long-term savings and faster break-even on your investment than a solar-only system.
