Energy density is becoming a key tool in optimising the economics of battery energy storage projects as suitable sites become harder to find.

In general, electrochemical energy storage has a short service life, relatively high LCOE, may cause environmental pollution, and have safety risks; in addition, some study suggests that Earth's metal resources may not be enough to support batteries for large-scale energy storage applications [3], [13], [74], [88], [89], [90].

When the energy storage density of the battery cells is not high enough, the energy of the batteries can be improved by increasing the number of cells, but, which also increases the weight of the vehicle and power consumption per mileage. The specific energy density is the energy that can be derived per unit weight of the cell (or sometimes per unit weight of the active electrode material). It is the product of the specific capacity and the operating voltage in one full discharge cycle.

The battery type considered within this Reference Architecture is LFP, which provides an optimal trade-off between the performance² parameters below:

- o Safety: LFP is considered to be one of the safest Lithium-Ion chemistries
- o Power density: LFP batteries can reach 240 W/kg
