By contrast, the low-tech firebrick thermal storage system would cost anywhere from one-tenth to one-fortieth as much as either of those options, Forsberg says. Firebrick itself is just a variant of ordinary bricks, made from clays that are capable of withstanding much higher temperatures, ranging up to 1,600 degrees Celsius or more.

Energy stored as sensible heat in materials. Example - Thermal Heat Energy stored in Granite. Heat is stored in 2 m^3 granite by heating it from $20 \text{ }^\circ\text{C}$ to $40 \text{ }^\circ\text{C}$. The density of granite is 2400 kg/m^3 and the specific heat of granite is $790 \text{ J/kg }^\circ\text{C}$. The thermal heat energy stored in the granite can be calculated as

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"The brick itself would be the battery." The novel device, described in Nature Communications on Tuesday, is a far cry from the megawatt-scale storage projects underway in places like California's desert and China's countryside. But D'Arcy said the paper shows, for the first time, that bricks can store electrical energy.

Now a team of researchers say a classic construction material--the red fired brick--could be a contender in the quest for energy storage. The common brick is porous like a sponge, and it's red color comes from pigmentation that is rich in iron oxide.

These materials find applications across different systems, including heating [4], heat exchangers [5, 6], solar thermal systems [7], crop drying systems [8], and thermal energy storage [9]. Notably, their use as wall materials in energy storage applications has been extensively researched and practically implemented.
