Pumped storage hydropower represents the bulk of the United States' current energy storage capacity: 23 gigawatts (GW) of the 24-GW national total (Denholm et al. 2021). This capacity was largely built between 1960 and 1990. PSH is a mature and proven method of energy storage with competitive round-trip efficiency and long life spans.

Nuclear energy's share of U.S. energy consumption peaked in 2020 at about 9% ...

Today, the United States has 43 existing PSH projects with over 22,800 megawatts of storage capacity, representing more than 94% of all installed capacity of energy storage. In the U.S. development pipeline, there are 67 PSH projects across 21 states representing over 50 GWs of new long duration storage.

Wind energy was the source of about 10% of total U.S. utility-scale electricity generation and accounted for 48% of the electricity generation from renewable sources in 2023.
