How does a smart warehouse work? Smart warehouses rely heavily on robotics, the Internet of Things and artificial intelligence to allow technology to perform tasks -- like managing inventory and locating products around the warehouse -- rather than having the job performed by humans. Other important components of a smart warehouse include:

2.1 Technical Requirements. The smart warehouse model system (Fig. 1a) comprised five automated guided vehicles (AGV) and was designed on a 1:10 scale; each AGV (Fig. 1b) manages two-sided rack arrays, including 14 × 7 × 2 = 196 slots. The maximum actual payload of the pallet is 1,500 kg. The standard pallet size is 1.2 m × 1.2 m × 1.7 m.
