As thermal energy storage is performed based on the heat changes in an energy storage medium, first, we need to define the branch of heat. There are two types of heat change in a material: sensible and latent heat. When energy is released from a material, the temperature of that material decreases.

Similar to residential unpressurized hot water storage tanks, high-temperature heat (170-560 °C) can be stored in molten salts by means of a temperature change. ... Thermal energy storage materials for chemical heat storage Chemical heat storage systems use reversible reactions which involve absorption and release of heat for the purpose of thermal energy storage. They have a middle range operating temperature between 200 °C and 400 °C.

The TES systems, which store energy by cooling, melting, vaporizing or condensing a substance (which, in turn, can be stored, depending on its operating temperature range, at high or at low temperatures in an insulated repository) [] can store heat energy of three different ways. Sensible heat thermal energy storage materials store heat energy in their specific heat capacity (C_p). The thermal energy stored by sensible heat can be expressed as $Q = m \cdot C_p \cdot \Delta T$ where m is the mass (kg), C_p is the specific heat capacity ($\text{kJ} \cdot \text{kg}^{-1} \cdot \text{K}^{-1}$) and ΔT is the raise in temperature during charging process. A tank thermal energy storage system generally consists of reinforced concrete or stainless-steel tanks as storage containers, with water serving as the heat storage medium. For the outside of the tank, extruded polystyrene (XPS) is used as an insulation material, and stainless steel is used for the interior to prevent water vapor from spreading.
