The principle of common temperature regulation is that water, having a high specific heat ( $4.2 \text{ J g}^{-1} \text{ }^\circ\text{C}^{-1}$ ) stores and releases energy as sensible heat [8], [9], while salt absorbs and releases heat during dissolution and decrystallization [10], [11].
