By using a heat pump, one unit of electricity is transformed into two to three units of heat, which can be stored in the particle thermal energy storage system and then later delivered to the end user (depending on the coefficient of performance of the heat pump or the use of an emerging pumped thermal energy storage technology).

A PTES system absorbs electricity from the grid and transforms it into thermal energy using a heat pump. The thermal energy is stored and later used to power a heat engine, producing electricity. The system uses a reversible cycle based on supercritical CO 2 to work as a heat pump and a heat engine.

The growing energy use by HVAC systems are particularly significant in developed countries. In the USA, HVAC energy use accounts for up to 50% of building energy consumption while in china the HVAC energy use is between 50 and 70% of the total energy consumed in buildings [4]. Heat pumps in conjunction with thermal energy storage provide system wide flexibility services such as load shifting, peak shaving, and demand side management, thereby ensuring increased utilisation of excess renewable energy during off-peak periods. Heat pumps can also utilise waste heat from data centres, sewage, and industrial processes.

Wang et al. [40], [41], [42] based on them, combined CO 2 heat pump water heaters with phase change thermal storage technology and thermal energy storage as a sub-cooler and proposed a heating system with integrated CO 2 heat pump water heater unit and thermal energy storage (as shown in Fig. 2).

Heat pumps and thermal energy storage for heating TES is very important in HP systems since it decreases the thermal capacity to less than the maximum heating requirement and enables a larger share of renewables. It balances system operation and allows an HP to operate at full capacity throughout the year, hence the SPF increases.



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The first sub-storage is the latent heat thermal energy storage (LH-TES) which contains a bundle of finned-tubes immersed in a tank filled with PCM to allow storing the thermal energy in the form of latent heat. The LH-TES is either the HTHP's condenser during the charging cycle, or the ORC''s evaporator during the discharging cycle.

To recover the energy, the heat pump is reversed to become a heat engine. The engine takes heat from the hot store, delivers waste heat to the cold store, and produces mechanical work. ...
