

Heat pump energy storage

Thermal Battery Storage Source Heat Pump Systems store that energy by melting ice for cooling while using less fan energy. This makes the energy extracted from the building (while cooling) reusable as stored water in the tank. The next time the system needs heating, the heat pump runs with the tank as the energy source.

In 2010, Desrues et al. were the first to present an investigation on a pumped thermal energy storage system for large scale electric applications based on Brayton cycle. The system works as a high temperature heat pump cycle during charging phase. It converts electricity into thermal energy and stores it inside two large man-made tanks.
