The energy storage system required for these missions largely depends on the particular type of space application. For instance, satellite batteries used in geostationary earth orbit (GEO) preferably require 180 cycles per year, whereas medium earth orbit (MEO) requires 5500 cycles per year.

In these battery systems, the Ag Zn battery was used in the early days of space missions such as the Russian spacecraft "Sputnik" and the US spacecraft "Ranger 3" .

A battery stores energy through a chemical reaction that occurs between its positive and negative electrodes. When the battery is being charged, this reaction is reversed, allowing the battery to store energy. When the battery is being discharged, the reaction occurs again, releasing the stored energy.
