What are technically recoverable resources? A common measure of the long-term viability of U.S. domestic natural gas and crude oil as energy sources are the remaining technically recoverable resources (TRR), which consist of proved reserves and unproved resources. 1 Estimates of TRR are highly uncertain, particularly in emerging plays where relatively few wells have been drilled.

The world consumes 132,290,211 million cubic feet (MMcf) of natural gas per year as of the year 2017. The world consumes 17,303 cubic feet of natural gas per capita every year (based on the 2017 world population of 7,645,617,954 people) or 47 cubic feet per capita per day.

Europe''s natural gas storage inventories are full at the start of the 2023-24 winter season. If normal weather conditions prevail, we expect less natural gas demand for heating in Europe and limited growth in demand from Asia compared with prior years. Under these conditions, the market should remain balanced during the upcoming winter season.
