The total work W needed to charge a capacitor is the electrical potential energy UC U C stored in it, or UC = W U C = W. When the charge is expressed in coulombs, potential is expressed in volts, and the capacitance is expressed in farads, this relation gives the energy in joules.

The energy UC U C stored in a capacitor is electrostatic potential energy and is thus related to the charge Q and voltage V between the capacitor plates. A charged capacitor stores energy in the electrical field between its plates. As the capacitor is being charged, the electrical field builds up.

The role of the dielectric is crucial as it influences the capacitor's ability to store energy. When a capacitor is connected to a voltage source, one plate becomes positively charged while the opposite plate accumulates an equal but opposite negative charge.

The energy stored on a capacitor can be expressed in terms of the work done by the battery. Voltage represents energy per unit charge, so the work to move a charge element dq from the negative plate to the positive plate is equal to V ...

He calculates the earth's capacitance at about 0.18 Farad, which seems surprisingly low, and from the known value of charge density at the surface of the earth (around 3 nC/sq.m) he shows that this capacitor holds a million Coulombs or so. Then it's a simple matter to calculate how much energy it's storing.

A charged capacitor stores energy in the electrical field between its plates. As the capacitor is being charged, the electrical field builds up. When a charged capacitor is disconnected from a battery, its energy remains in the field in the space between its plates.



A defibrillator uses the energy stored in the capacitor. The audio equipment, uninterruptible power supplies, camera flashes, pulsed loads such as magnetic coils and lasers use the energy stored in the capacitors.
