How Much Energy Can You Store? Stored energy is measured in kilowatt-hours or kWh, and the amount you need depends on several factors. This depends entirely upon the system you purchase. Some energy storage systems can hold 10 kWh, which is more than enough to offset peak energy usage for the average household.

A capacitor is a charge and energy storage device. The stored energy is proportional to the square of the magnitude of the charge on the plates. The expression for stored energy in the capacitor is given as: ( $\text{PE} = \frac{Q^2}{2C}$ ) ... (i) Here, C is the capacitance and Q is the charge on the capacitor plates.
