To do this, you must know the wattage rating of the device in watts (or voltage x current rating = power rating) and the operation time of the appliance in hours.

As you might remember from our article on Ohm's law, the power P of an electrical device is equal to voltage V multiplied by current I : $P = V \cdot I$. As energy E is power P multiplied by time T , all we have to do to find the energy stored in a battery is to multiply both sides of the equation by time: $E = V \cdot I \cdot T$. Hopefully, you remember that amp hours are a measure of electric charge Q ...

To do this, add up the power consumption of all critical loads that require backup power, and multiply this by the number of hours you need the backup power to last. For example, if your critical loads require 2,000 watts of power and you need backup power for 24 hours, your total load would be 48,000 watt-hours (2,000 watts x 24 hours).
