Coated steel tanks are the most economical but don't have high durability over time. Stainless steel tanks come with a longer warranty and weigh less but cost significantly more than coated steel options. Stone-lined tanks have longer lifetimes than other models but weigh more than coated steel tanks, potentially increasing shipping costs.

There are two basic Thermal Energy Storage (TES) Strategies, latent heat systems and sensible heat systems. Stratification is used within the tank as a strategy for thermal layering of the stored water. Colder water is denser and will settle toward the bottom of the tank, while the warmer water will naturally seek to rise to the top.

Thermal stores are highly insulated water tanks that can store heat as hot water for several hours. They usually serve two or more functions: Provide hot water, just like a hot water cylinder. Store heat from a solar thermal system or biomass boiler, for providing heating later in the day.; Act as a "buffer" for heat pumps to meet extra hot water demand.

Thermal energy storage tanks are often found in district cooling systems. They are usually made of concrete and their physical size is big. So, how does it work in district cooling and what exactly is thermal energy storage? In district cooling, thermal energy storage tanks are used to store cooling energy at night where the electricity is cheaper.

Regular maintenance of solar thermal storage tanks typically includes checking for leaks, corrosion, and scale buildup; inspecting valves and seals; cleaning the solar collectors; and ensuring that insulation and mounting structures are in good condition.

Some storage water heater models have heavily insulated tank, which significantly reduce standby heat losses and lower annual operating costs. Look for models with tanks that have a thermal resistance (R-Value) of R-24 and above to avoid adding an insulation blanket (electric water heaters only).
