

How to place energy storage cylinders

Gas cylinders must be stored in a storage area which is well ventilated, weather-proof and a safe distance from any combustible materials or heat sources. Hazard classifications should be used to separate incompatible gases so that they are stored at least 20 feet apart or by fireproof partitions.

In addition to the gas chemical hazards, the amount of energy resulting from the compression of the gas makes a compressed gas cylinder a potential rocket. The Global Harmonized System (GHS) has created classification criteria that determine the nature and relative hazard severity of a chemical substance or mixture.

The cylinders are constructed to store and transport a range of compressed gases such as oxygen, nitrogen and acetylene. While these cylinders are essential for many operations, they can pose a significant health and safety risk if they are not stored correctly. Temperature is another important consideration for cylinder storage. Compressed gas cylinders should be stored at temperatures no higher than 125°F (52°C). Gas expands when it's heated, which increases pressure in the cylinder - and this can lead to a malfunction. Within a cylinder's main gas valve is a pressure relief valve.
