



# How to use outdoor energy storage tanks

Don't Store Propane Tanks on Wet Ground or Surfaces. Avoid storage spots with a wet ground or surface. The tank's metal is prone to rust, which eats at the tank and compromises the tank's structure. And you should never use a compromised tank. Store your tank off the ground and in an environment free of excessive moisture.

On the other hand, outdoor storage leaves the air receiver tank vulnerable to temperature extremes and moisture damage. Make sure your climate is suitable for outdoor placement of your compressed air tank. That means using electrochemical storage to meet electric loads and thermal energy storage for thermal loads.

It uses standard cooling equipment with the addition of an ice-filled storage tank. The ice storage tank is insulated and contains internal baffles or diffusers to maximize heat transfer between the ice inside the tank and the entering and leaving chilled water (Fig. 3 below).
