Bosch Rexroth's HRB system couples a hydraulic axial piston pump/motor into a mechanical drivetrain through a gearbox. When braking, the pump/motor captures kinetic energy from deceleration and converts it to hydraulic energy. This energy is stored in an accumulator and later converted back to kinetic energy to accelerate the vehicle.

The motor pump is composed of DC brushless motor and a high-speed piston pump.
