Pumped storage hydropower (PSH) is a type of hydroelectric energy storage. It is a configuration of two water reservoirs at different elevations that can generate power as water moves down from one to the other (discharge), passing through a turbine. The system also requires power as it pumps water back into the upper reservoir (recharge).

This is achieved by means of a hydraulic pump that, fed through the electrical grid (10), transforms the electrical energy into mechanical energy by propelling the water through a penstock (2) and a conduction tunnel (5). Once at the top, the upper reservoir (3) acts as a water storage tank.

It should be also kept in perspective that pumped hydro energy storage system is a net consumer of electricity as it takes more energy to pump the water uphill than is generated during the fall of water, hence the benefit of pumped hydro energy storage comes from storing power generated during low demand, which is released when demand is high .

The pumped hydro energy storage system (PHS) is based on pumping water from one reservoir to another at a

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higher elevation, often during off-peak and other low electricity demand periods. When electricity is needed, water is released from the upper reservoir through a hydroelectric turbine and collected in the lower reservoir .
