These are associated with the "engineering elastic moduli": Young"s modulus, shear modulus, and bulk modulus, shown schematically in Figure 1. The Young"s modulus or modulus of elasticity, Y, is used to calculate the tensile strain (D 1/1) along the same axis as an applied tensile stress s.

The elastic moduli are a measure of bond stiffness, which in turn is a strong function of bond length. Shorter and stronger bonds will lead to a stiffer lattice and larger values of elastic moduli. In covalent bonds, this can be seen as an ...

The storage modulus quantifies the ability of a material to store energy elastically, while the loss modulus describes its ability to dissipate energy.
