A particular load switch can easily be narrowed down at Load Switches, since the load switches can be sorted by rise time. For some battery operated systems, there is a power budget that must be met when operating in different modes. This section will illustrate the potential power savings with a load switch in the power path.

3. Operation closing: Put the handle of the electric closing (opening) operation switch in the ready closing position, and then turn the switch to the closing position (this rotation should not exceed three seconds), and the load break switch (circuit breaker) acts to the closing state.

For the high-power pulsed system of the capacitive energy storage, the closed switch is one of the most important devices and plays the role to transmit the energy storage and the load in the pulsed regime. The gas spark gap switch, because of its high voltage and current, is widely used in the field of the high-power pulsed system 1.

Pulsed power is produced by transferring a primary stored energy to a load quickly. Though chemical energy sources such as batteries or explosives or kinetic energy sources such as generators may be used as the primary stored electrical energy, in fact, capacitors and inductors are the most common methods.

The on-resistance of the load switch is a characteristic of the pass FET and will be used in calculating the

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power dissipated by the load switch. The pass FET can be either an N-channel or P-channel FET, which will determine the architecture of the load switch.

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In many designs, there are sub-systems that are only used during certain modes of operation. Load switches can be used to limit the amount of leakage current and power consumption by turning off power to these sub-systems. Figure 5 shows a comparison of the leakage current with and without a load switch.

All load switches offer a fixed or adjustable rise time which controls the inrush current and slew rate of the device. A controlled slew rate results in a smooth output voltage ramp without negative voltage spikes or drops in input voltage when the device turns on, as shown in Figure 6.

Integrated load switches are a great way to reduce board space and improve switching performance and protection over existing discrete MOSFET solutions. This application note goes into detail on how to identify what features are present in a discrete MOSFET solution as well as the design advantages and simplifications of integrated load switches.

When the load switch turns off, QOD turns on to discharge the load capacitance faster. The way that the load capacitor is discharged depends on the biasing conditions of the transistor. See Figure 8. If the transistor is in forward-active mode, it acts as a constant current sink.

The energy storage in a switch after it is closed is due to several factors: 1. Capacitive effects in circuit elements lead to temporary energy retention, 2. Inductive components such as coils can momentarily hold energy, 3.

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
