Energy Storage in Capacitors (contd.)  $W = \frac{1}{2} C V^2$  It shows that the energy stored within a capacitor is proportional to the product of its capacitance and the squared value of the voltage across the capacitor. Recall that we also can determine the stored energy from the fields within the dielectric:  $W = \frac{1}{2} \int \mathbf{D} \cdot \mathbf{E} \, dV$  ...

Energy Stored in a Capacitor. Moving charge from one initially-neutral capacitor plate to the other is called charging the capacitor. When you charge a capacitor, you are storing energy in that capacitor. Providing a conducting path for the charge to go back to the plate it came from is called discharging the capacitor.

Capacitors used for energy storage. Capacitors are devices which store electrical energy in the form of electrical charge accumulated on their plates. When a capacitor is connected to a power source, it accumulates energy which can be released when the capacitor is disconnected from the charging source, and in this respect they are similar to batteries.

Energy Storage in Capacitors. When a capacitor is charged, energy is converted from electrical energy to energy stored in a material polarization which is energy of the charge separation. When it is discharged, energy is converted from energy stored in the material polarization back to electrical energy of flowing electrons.
