

Phase change energy storage calculation problem

Energy and Phase Changes. When adding or removing heat from a system one of three things can occur: Temperature Change within a phase (physical change) Phase Change between two phases (physical change) Adding heat can cause a chemical reaction (chemical change) In this section we shall look at changes between two phases.

Thermal energy storage based on the use of latent heat is linked inherently to the processes of solid-liquid phase change during which the heat is alternately charged into the system and discharged from it. These phenomena - melting and solidification - have unique physical characteristics.

Energy storage technologies include sensible and latent heat storage. As an important latent heat storage method, phase change cold storage has the effect of shifting peaks and filling valleys and improving energy efficiency, especially for cold chain logistics [6], air conditioning [7], building energy saving [8], intelligent temperature control of human body [9] ...
