Where (  $\overline{C}_p$  ) is the average specific heat of the storage material within the temperature range. Note that constant values of density  $\rho$  ( $\text{kg.m}^{-3}$ ) are considered for the majority of storage materials applied in buildings. For packed bed or porous medium used for thermal energy storage, however, the porosity of the material should also be taken into account.

Latent heat storage systems use the reversible enthalpy change  $Dh_{pc}$  of a material (the phase change material = PCM) that undergoes a phase change to store or release energy. Fundamental to latent heat storage is the high energy density near the phase change temperature  $t_{pc}$  of the storage material. This makes PCM systems an attractive solution for ...

Working principle of heat storage in tanks. Most renewable energy heat sources need a heat storage tank. Solar thermal collectors, biomass boilers, and heat pump applications are just a few examples of heat sources. Recent trends are related to the application of more efficient heat storage tanks based on latent heat energy storage.

Thermal energy storage materials for chemical heat storage Chemical heat storage systems use reversible reactions which involve absorption and release of heat for the purpose of thermal energy storage. They have a middle range operating temperature between  $200 \text{ }^\circ\text{C}$  and  $400 \text{ }^\circ\text{C}$ .

Sensible heat thermal energy storage materials store heat energy in their specific heat capacity ( $C_p$ ). The thermal energy stored by sensible heat can be expressed as  $(1) Q = m \cdot C_p \cdot \Delta T$  where  $m$  is the mass (kg),  $C_p$  is the specific heat capacity ( $\text{kJ.kg}^{-1}.\text{K}^{-1}$ ) and  $\Delta T$  is the raise in temperature during charging process.
