2.4.3 Working Principles of Thermal Energy Storage Systems. The operational principles of thermal energy storage systems are identical as other forms of energy storage methods, as mentioned earlier. A typical thermal energy storage system consists of three sequential processes: charging, storing, and discharging periods.

The research involves the review, scoping, and preliminary assessment of energy storage technologies that could complement the operational characteristics and parameters to improve fossil thermal plant economics,

reduce cycling, and minimize overall system costs.

Pumped Storage Power Plant. A pumped storage power plant (PSPP) is a type of mechanical ESS where potential energy is stored (during periods of excess energy) by pumping water from a lower basin to an upper basin (when water flows back into the lower basin, under the influence of gravity, a turbine is driven to generate energy).

The concept of using Thermal Energy Storage (TES) for regulating the thermal plant power generation was initially reported in [1] decades ago. Several studies [2, 3] were recently reported on incorporation of TES into Combined Heat and Power (CHP) generations, in which TES is used to regulate the balance of the demand for heat and electricity supply.

With energy storage, the plant can provide CO₂ continuously while allowing the power to be provided to the grid when needed. In short, energy storage can have a significant impact on the unit's competitiveness.
