

Single chamber energy storage unit

A typical thermal energy storage system consists of three sequential processes: charging, storing, and discharging periods. These periods are operated in a cyclic manner in a certain period which will be determined according to the storage purpose. Figure 2.7 demonstrates a basic storage cycle.

Nevertheless, the energy storage units, i.e. supercapacitor or battery cells, typically work at an operational voltage of lower than 5 V and require a large current (mA level) to be fully charged. Meantime, the internal impedance of the energy storage cell is typically smaller than 100 ohm level (depending on the capacity of the cell).

Multiple technoeconomic analyses put the target cost of energy storage at <\$100 per kWh and power at <\$600 per kW. Additional targets for sustainable EES systems are >10000 cycles with <80% capacity fade, and energy efficiencies of >60%. Based on the current trajectory of mainstream battery research, these targets will be difficult to reach.

Capacity defines the energy stored in the system and depends on the storage process, the medium and the size of the system;. Power defines how fast the energy stored in the system can be discharged (and charged);.
