The European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD) has allocated a new loan to ACWA Power for the development, design, construction and operation of a 200 MW solar photovoltaic power plant and 500 MWh battery energy storage system (BESS) located in the Tashkent region in Uzbekistan.

The deal covers the construction of a photovoltaic (PV) park in the Tashkent province of northeastern Uzbekistan. Once up and running, the complex is expected to generate 900 million kWh of electricity annually, replacing 257 million cubic metres of natural gas.
