Over the last 10 years, investments in renewable energy sources such as wind power and solar power allowed the country to cover in early 2016 94.5% of its electricity needs with renewable energy

Argentina also has interconnections with neighbouring countries: a 2 000 MW capacity line at 500 kV voltage with Uruguay; a 2 200 MW converter station with Brazil (in addition to the Paso de los Libres - Uruguayana 50 MW/132 kV connection); a 1 550 MW capacity when the energy flows to Paraguay and 750 MW when it flows to Argentina; and a 200 MW ...

The Salto Grande hydroelectric complex is a 1,890MW bi-national hydroelectric power plant located on the border between Concordia (Argentina) and Salto (Uruguay). The 40-year-old power plant is owned and operated by a bi-national organisation called the Salto Grande Mixed Technical Commission (CTM).

Uruguay is a small country in Latin America with a population of 3,461,734 (2019) and a GDP of US\$59.6 Billion (2018). The country has 176,220 km² of land with rolling plains and hills, including a forest area of 19,890 km² [1]. The land and climate are suitable for good agriculture and livestock, while Uruguay also has 410 miles of coastline with beaches.

The PRONOS project, funded by CAF with the purpose of supporting Uruguay's Electricity Market Administrator (ADME), aims to include the wind and solar resources outlook in the optimal operating tools for Uruguay's National Interconnected System (SIN), which until now had only considered fuel availability for thermal power plants, and water resources for hydro power plants.

Given that Uruguay's power system already has close to 100% renewable generation, there is no room to explore a more ambitious renewable energy scenario for the power sector.
