How Wave Energy Devices Work How Wave Energy Devices Work. Tidal wave energy is based on the power of the ocean. Ocean wave energy is a non-polluting, sustainable and renewable source of energy which is safe to use, but understanding how wave energy devices work is key to getting the most from this free and limitless resource.

For domestic applications, one way of extracting this heat energy is by the use of geothermal heat pump technology. The geothermal heat pump doesn't create electricity, instead it circulates a thermally conductive liquid mixed with water through long pipes called an Earth loop buried up to 12 feet underground, operating on the same principle as the domestic refrigerator but in reverse.

Energy density is similar to the size of the pool, while power density is comparable to draining the pool as quickly as possible. The Department of Energy"s Vehicle Technologies Office (VTO) works on increasing the energy density of batteries, while reducing the cost, and maintaining an acceptable power density.

Storage Technology Basics A Brief Introduction to Batteries 1. Negative electrode: "The reducing or fuel electrode--which gives up electrons to the external circuit and is oxidized during the electrochemical reaction."

2. Positive electrode: "The oxidizing electrode--which accepts electrons from the external circuit and is reduced during the electrochemical reaction."
