Notably, ice-water PCM is the oldest and best known storage material but it is not the most preferable type for large scale energy applications, due to its drawbacks including low thermal conductivity, limited temperature range and slow energy-charging; therefore ice-water thermal storages are primarily designated for domestic applications.

Consequently, water is a suitable heat storage material, and water is today used as a heat storage material in almost all heat stores for energy systems making use of a heat storage operating in the temperature interval from 0 °C to 100 °C. 2.2. Principles of sensible heat storage systems involving water

Where (\overline{C}_p) is the average specific heat of the storage material within the temperature range. Note that constant values of density ρ (kg.m⁻³) are considered for the majority of storage materials applied in buildings.For packed bed or porous medium used for thermal energy storage, however, the porosity of the material should also be taken into account.

UTES (underground thermal energy storage), in which the storage medium may be geological strata ranging from earth or sand to solid bedrock, or aquifers. UTES technologies include: ATES (aquifer thermal energy storage).An ATES store is composed of a doublet, totaling two or more wells into a deep aquifer that is

contained between impermeable geological layers above and ...

2.1 Sensible-Thermal Storage. Sensible storage of thermal energy requires a perceptible change in temperature. A storage medium is heated or cooled. The quantity of energy stored is determined by the specific thermal capacity (c_p -value) of the material. Since, with sensible-energy storage systems, the temperature differences between the storage medium ...

Considering the specific capacity, cost and temperature range, solid and liquid are generally chosen as the heat storage medium. Solid materials (temperature changes over 100 °C) such as non ...
