Compressed air energy storage (CAES) plants are largely equivalent to pumped-hydro power plants in terms of their applications. But, instead of pumping water from a lower to an upper pond during periods of excess power, in a CAES plant, ambient air or another gas is compressed and stored under pressure in an underground cavern or container.

There are various forms of energy storage in use today. Electrochemical batteries, like the lithium-ion batteries in electric cars, use electrochemical reactions to store energy. Energy can also be stored by making fuels such as hydrogen, which can be burned when energy is most needed.

This installation stores natural gas in its gaseous form at high pressure in cavities leached out in a layer of salt at a depth of 2000 m (6000 ft). To carry out the leaching operation a concentric arrangement of tubing is installed into the salt and is used to pump in the sea water and remove the brine produced.

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In addition to this physically unrecoverable gas, underground storage facilities contain what is known as base gas or cushion gas. This is the volume of gas that must remain in the storage facility to provide the required pressurization to extract the remaining gas.

Gas in an underground storage facility is divided into two categories, working gas (top gas) and cushion gas (base gas). Working gas (top gas) - the volume of gas in the reservoir above the designed level of cushion gas. If the Conditions allow it, a percentage or all of the working gas capacity could be injected and withdrawn more than once during any season.

The types of gas storage include salt cavern, depleted oil and gas reservoir and aquifer.
