

The principles of mechanical energy storage are based on classical Newtonian mechanics, or in other words on fundamental physics from the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. As a result, these types of storage are typically divided into two categories; storage of kinetic and potential energy, or storage of "pressure energy".

Another theoretical mechanical stored energy concept is called the gravity power storage system. Unlike the hydraulic rock storage system described in Abschn. 9.3.2.1, the dimensions of the gravity power system are small. The storage principle is also slightly different, since it uses the same principle as the power tower system (Abschn. 9.3.2.3).

- 1.Mechanical Energy Storage Systems. Mechanical energy storage systems capitalize on physical mechanics to store and subsequently release energy. Pumped hydro storage exemplifies this, where water is elevated to higher reservoirs during periods of low energy demand and released to produce electricity during peak demand times.
- 4.1 Mechanical storage systems. The generation of world electricity is mainly depending on mechanical storage systems (MSSs). Three types of MSSs exist, namely, flywheel energy storage (FES), pumped hydro storage (PHS) and compressed air energy storage (CAES). PHS, which is utilized in pumped hydroelectric power plants, is the most popular MSS.

Pumped storage, also called micro pumped hydro storage, is the most mature electric energy storage technology at present, the main application fields include power system peak cutting and valley filling, frequency and phase regulation and emergency power supply backup. Pumped storage is also the largest installed technology, accounting for more than 90% of the ...

Mechanical storage systems work on the basis of storing available and off-peak excessive electricity in the form of mechanical energy. Once the demand for electricity power overcome the available energy supply, the stored energy would be release to meet with the energy demand.

The flywheel continues to store energy as long as it continues to spin; in this way, flywheel energy storage systems act as mechanical energy storage. When this energy needs to be retrieved, the rotor transfers its rotational energy back to a generator, effectively converting it into usable electrical energy.

Fig. 4 illustrates a schematic representation and architecture of two types of flywheel energy storage unit. A flywheel energy storage unit is a mechanical system designed to store and release energy efficiently. It consists of a high-momentum flywheel, precision bearings, a vacuum or low-pressure enclosure to minimize energy losses due to friction and air resistance, a ...

Mechanical energy storage systems include gravitational energy storage or pumped hydropower storage (PHPS), compressed air energy storage (CAES) and flywheels. The PHPS and CAES technologies can be used for large-scale utility energy storage while flywheels are more suitable for intermediate storage.

In this service, mechanical energy storage technologies, such as PHS, CAES, and GES are used to store energy during the time of excess production of power and to inject back energy into the grid during limited generation of power. In this service, power is delivered by the storage technology for several hours.
