Electrochemical energy storage systems have the potential to make a major contribution to the implementation of sustainable energy. Energy storage development trend. Even though affected by supply chain shortages, energy storage is becoming one of the projects promoted in many countries. 2021 saw the largest new global energy storage commissioning, surpassing 10GW for the first time, reaching 10.2GW, 2.2 times the new commissioning in 2020, an increase of 117% year-on-year.

The principle of operation of electrochemical energy storage devices is based on the formation of a chemical reaction between the electrolyte and the electrodes contained in it. Then there is a shortage of electrons on one of the electrodes and an excess on the other. This allows chemical energy to be converted into electrical energy.

Among the many available options, electrochemical energy storage systems with high power and energy densities have offered tremendous opportunities for clean, flexible, efficient, and reliable energy storage deployment on a large scale. They thus are attracting unprecedented interest from governments, utilities, and transmission operators.

Electrochemical capacitors (ECs), also known as supercapacitors or ultracapacitors, are typically classified into two categories based on their different energy storage mechanisms, i.e., electric double layer capacitors (EDLCs) and pseudocapacitors. First, EDLCs store charges physically in electric double layers forming near the electrode/electrolyte interfaces.

As a result, it is increasingly assuming a significant role in the realm of energy storage [4]. The performance of electrochemical energy storage devices is significantly influenced by the properties of key component materials, including separators, binders, and electrode materials. This area is currently a focus of research.
