Theoretical energy density is the product of theoretical cell voltage and charge density. These measures can be calculated from knowledge of the chemical reactions involved using information found in the periodic table. Practical specific energy and practical energy density are typically 25-35% below the theoretical values [128, ch. 1.5].

o Energy Density (Wh/L) - The nominal battery energy per unit volume, sometimes referred to as the volumetric energy density. Specific energy is a characteristic of the battery chemistry and packaging. Along with the energy consumption of the vehicle, it determines the battery size required to achieve a given electric range.

When the application requires discharge over several hours, a high energy density cell is needed. High energy density is achieved by coating thicker layers of active material onto the current collectors. However, there are some limitations to how thick the electrode can be without affecting the overall performance of the cell.

Energy density is the amount of energy stored in a region of space per unit volume or mass. It is usually desirable that the energy density stored in an LIB system is as high as possible. The unit of energy density is Wh/kg, which is calculated by: where E is the voltage (V) and Q is the specific capacity (Ah/kg).

Another interesting use of energy storage density calculations is how they can be used to analyze the energy storage density possible from one electrolyte. Using the Nernst equation of a half-reaction vs the SHE within Eq. 12 provides a means of evaluating what we will call the partial energy storage density of an RFB electrolyte. Similar to ...
